# Dick Cavett Tells Stories of Talk Show Guests to PPB Crowd

PPB Luncheon Re-cap Written by Frank and Margie Barron

From 1968 to 1975, DICK CAVETT emerged as TV's talk show host who was renowned for getting extraordinary interviews with the celebrities who fiercely guarded their privacy. Among the guests on ABC's *The Dick Cavett Show* were KATHARINE HEPBURN, FRED ASTAIRE, MARLON BRANDO, ORSON WELLES, and JOHN LENNON and YOKO ONO, who appeared right after the breakup of The Beatles in 1971.



Cavett also proved he wasn't afraid of confronting the controversial political personalities of the era, and was respected for interviewing figures from both sides of the issues. That gave him a significant broadcasting role as the Watergate scandal unfolded and he questioned a parade of "Watergate characters" including G. GORDON LIDDY, JOHN EHRLICHMAN, members of the Senate Watergate committee, etc. That put him on the infamous "Nixon's

enemies list," he proudly points out. PBS just aired a special *Dick Cavett's Watergate* on the 40th anniversary of President **RICHARD NIXON**'s resignation, featuring fascinating clips from his talk shows.

Cavett talked about all of that and more when PPB feted him. But before he was presented the coveted **ART GILMORE** Career Achievement Award from PPB President **CHUCK STREET**, there was an enlightening chat between Street and Cavett that captivated the audience for almost two hours.



There was a large crowd at the Sportsmen's Lodge to hear Dick Cavett's stories filled with luminaries, history and wit. And afterwards they lined up to get him to sign copies of his latest book *Brief Encounters: Conversations, Magic Moments and Assorted Hijinks*, which had even more stories to be enjoyed.

Cavett, who turned 78 on November 19th, seemed to be more comfortable talking about

the many famous talk show guests and friends in his life than discussing anything personal. But he did tell a sweet story about meeting his wife MARTHA ROGERS, Ph.D. when he tried to help her rescue two stray dogs. "As we walked around for a couple of hours trying to find the dogs' owners, we just talked and that was a nice way of getting to know each other," he recalled. Martha was at the PPB event and he praised her many accomplishments and his admiration for her as an author.

Talking about Cavett's "midwest sensibility," Chuck Street noted that "like JOHNNY CARSON, Dick was born and raised in Nebraska." Cavett acknowledged that there are many, including DAVID LETTERMAN, "from the midwest who succeeded in broadcasting because the midwest accent was more comfortable to people."

In high school, Cavett took to performing magic and was good at gymnastics. He went to Yale University where he majored in English and drama. He enjoyed the stage and appeared in numerous stage and radio productions and spent several summers doing Shakespeare Festivals.

When he moved to New York and got a job as a copyboy at *Time* magazine, fate stepped in when he went to a taping of *The Tonight Show* hosted by **JACK PAAR**. Cavett said he heard that "Paar wanted jokes for his monologue, so I wrote some and I had them in an envelope. When I saw Paar in the hallway I handed them to him and I got a job writing jokes for Jack." That led to a regular job as a comedy writer for both Paar and Carson. He even wound up as a guest host on several *Tonight* shows and also established himself as a comedian.

His on-camera work led to hosting a morning program and then *The Dick Cavett Show*, his own acclaimed late-night series. The stories about his outstanding guests are fascinating. He said, "KATHARINE HEPBURN came in early to rearrange the furniture, and set up the best camera angles for her. After a brief run-through she said 'let's do it now,' and we did, without an audience." He said GROUCHO MARX always had great stories, "and he was just plain funny." He coaxed FRED ASTAIRE into a few dance steps that turned into a wildly improvised dance number that showed off the skill and vitality of the dance master at almost 80 years old. The PPB crowd was treated to clips of those TV shows and Cavett loved seeing them again, too. (Clips from Dick's career were produced and edited by PPB Board Member JHANI KAYE.)

By 16, he was performing in night clubs and making guest appearances on TV. At 19 he was a semi-regular on The Steve Allen Show, and was guest booting on The Carry Moore Show. It wasn't long before be hosting on *The Garry Moore Show*. It wasn't long before he had his own show in New York: *The Chuck McCann Show*, a favorite of children and adults for 14 years.

When **ALAN ARKIN** was searching for an actor to play a deaf mute in his film *The Heart Is A Lonely Hunter*, his 11-yearold son ADAM ARKIN recommended Chuck. Alan took the suggestion and Chuck delivered a performance worthy of a Golden Circle Award and Motion Picture Daily Award

as best supporting actor. Chuck's co-starred in such films as Silent Movie, Play It as It Lays, Disney's Herbie Rides Again, Foul Play, and MEL BROOKS' Robin Hood: Men in Tights. Chuck has long been a favorite guest on talk and variety shows as well as guest starring on as well as guest starring on series such as Little House on the Prairie, Different Strokes, One Day at a Time, and The Love Boăt.

Here's another dimension of his talent ... Chuck's written and recorded over a dozen comedy albums, from *The* First Family to Everything You Always Wanted To Know About The Godfather But Don't Ask.

Chuck has had a long award-winning career in commercials and has won several Clio awards for best actor in those commercials, such as Dr. Pepper, where he played the Hunchback of Notre Dame, and the LAUREL and HARDY commercials for AMCO windshield wiper blades. Chuck created the Coco Bird and Gramps in the Coco Puffs radio spots and is still doing the commercials to this day.

He's also had a stunning career in animation including *Duck Tales the Movie* and *A Very Mickey Christmas* for Disney, and he played The Thing in the animated version of *Fantastic Christmas* for the property of Four. Chuck toured with TIM CONWAY in a live show for three years.




